

New Brighton Library Activities Report Jan 2013

Monday 14th – Butterfly sun-catchers

To kick of the holiday program, we had a craft activity of creating sun-catchers. The children had an earlier prepared butterfly shape on black card, they then filled the space in the wings with different coloured cellophane and tissue paper, and to finish this was laminated. This could be stuck on windows, or hung in areas where the sun could shine through and catch the colours of the butterfly wings. The children seemed to have fun, and parents commented it was a great simple craft which allowed children to be creative in their own way.



Tuesday 15th – Board games (was planned Cheapskates Skate School)

On this date we had booked the Cheapskates Skate School to come into New Brighton and teach children to skate, etc, but unfortunately the rain didn't agree and we had to

replace this activity with board games inside the library as a result of the rain. As a result of the rain, numbers were low, but the children who took part had a great time, and enjoyed interacting with both other children and the Youth Alive leaders.

Wednesday 16th - Personalised pencils

In this activity, the children took it as an opportunity to showcase their talent and creativity to us! We were amazed at the different concepts and ideas they came up with to create beautiful toppers for the end of their pencils. This was a very hands on activity, and we were lucky to have a number of parents only too happy to assist.



Thursday 17th – Boat making and racing

Following the creativity of children earlier in the week, we left this activity open for children to create their own boat designs and concepts which they created with our assistance. We were blown away by the ingenuity of the children taking part- some wonderful boats were created by the children. They then took these down to the pool to race, and we received feedback from parents and children it was a terrific activity they all enjoyed.

Friday 18th- String Bird Cages (Balloon lanterns).

This activity was similar to papier-mâché, however instead of using paper to cover the entire balloon, string is used with spaces left-following drying, and the popping of the balloon this should resemble a bird cage. Creating this artwork was a very messy task, nevertheless we received nothing but positive feedback from parents, children and librarians regarding the activity this day. Children enjoyed that the activity was hands on, and were happy they could take their artwork home with them.



New Brighton Library Activities Report Jan 2013

Monday 21st – Window Pictures

In creating window pictures, children create an image inside a laminating sheet using craft supplies such as tissue, cellophane, feathers, etc, and then this is laminated. The activity was very simple, but allowed for children to converse and form relationships with each other which was great- especially for children who are regulars in the library.

Tuesday 22nd – Kite making and flying

On Tuesday the children put together kites then we took them all outside and flew them. The children were ecstatic throughout this activity- from putting them together, to decorating them, to flying the kites outside- they all enjoyed every stage of the activity. Parents commented they were stoked delighted the children were taking part in an activity which explored both their creativity, and their natural environment.



Wednesday 23rd – Sports Day

On this day we had Mitch from Sports Canterbury in to run sports and activated with the children. Unfortunately on this date the weather was over 30 degrees, and the cool water of te beach was deemed far more attractive than sports under the scorching hot sun. Although our numbers were very low, the children who did take part had an amazing time, and were very thankful for the adult interaction they received.

Thursday 24th – Natural Magic Puppet Show

The children had smiles on their faces throughout this activity, and they shared with us they wished the show would never end. This show attracted a mixture of primary school and pre-school aged children, along with parents/grand parents, but all we received much positive feedback.



Friday 25th - Science Alive



We had 2 teachers from Science Alive come in and run educational craft activities with the children. These activities were different to our usual format, as they ran many activities over the session, where as we usually run just one craft. However children adapted to and enjoyed the variation, interacting well with the science alive staff, but enjoying the support and encouragement of us Youth Alive leaders as they have grown comfortable and safe in our company. Children learnt, and created some interesting crafts to take home which made for a good day.
