Holiday Activities Report





Overall the 2 week holiday program was a success. I heard really positive feedback from both kids who enjoyed the activities and parents who enjoyed not having to provide afternoon entertainment and were actually able to enjoy the activity with their child. The main age group would have been 7-10 although ages varied from 4-17. Some activities ran smoother than others, in general, weather dependent activities tended to not work as well. i.e. Frisbee golf did not work very well because of a windy day, in anticipation of this I took some heavier rings for the activity but because of an unexpectedly large crowd from an OSCAR program this activity did not run as smoothly as it could have on a pleasant day.

The activities that worked the best were those which could be set up and allowed an element of freedom for the kids as they tended to come-and go and allowed me to roam and help where needed rather than being torn between 'stages' or 'instructions'. Some of these included sock puppets, biscuit decorating, and jewellery. Because I was the only worker, on activities that were particularly popular I stayed very busy for the duration of the activity and did not get much of a chance to interact as much as I would like or take photos, etc.
