July Holiday Activities Report

The holiday activities are growing in success as regular children keep coming back and new ones continue to find out about it. We interacted with 262 young people over the 2 week period – even more if we count the official figures for the Mindball activity that was organised by the Library!

This program started on a high, working alongside Kidz Fest for Mindball and drawing in 283 people of all ages to participate and have a go. This was a fantastic activity as there really was no age barrier! This activity was by far the most popular, with cookie decorating having the second-highest numbers and sitting on 40 children. As usual with cookie decorating, there was a big rush at the start when the majority of people are there, but this was short lived and within 20minutes many people had moved on. Those who were left and those



who came late formed a nice sized group which allowed for more hands on interaction from me which I really enjoyed!



Other popular activities included the Puppet show with 35 people, Nerf day and the Photo Challenge, both with 30 participants and Simple Sewing, Mosaics and Jewelry Making which all had between 20-25 kids. All three of these activities were really good, as they all provided opportunity to teach new skills to kids who otherwise may not have the opportunity to learn them. Parents mentioned using the activities at home with their children, or at their local play-center/ kindergarten.



There were potential risks with the mosaics and sewing, but this was avoided by ensuring parental supervision for younger children, having first aid on-hand, using thick and slightly blunter needles and giving clear warnings of the risks for people to be aware of.

The Cheap Skates activity was cancelled due to wet

weather and for those who

were in the library we opened up the pipe-line allowing kids to get games without a library card under my supervision and played card and board games. Overall the holiday program was a real success though; it gave parents a 'break' in the sense that they were able to take a back-seat in the activity, and gave children and youth some stimulation away from computers and a break from boredom.
