During one of the times I met up with him he told me that "I really don't have anyone at home and everything there is still crap, I really don't like much at the moment... but I like Wednesdays because I get to spend time with you." It didn't take much other than going for a walk, listening and being consistent to make a world of difference for him.









CENTRAL NEW BRIGHTON SCHOOL

Term four at central has been a busy one, it feels like we crammed more than 12 weeks into only 9!

Highlights from this term at Central included making Morning tea for the staff with two year 3's that I have been working with all year, going on camp with the year 6's and 7's, being involved with the leadership group and running various lunch time activities on Tuesday lunches!

This terms lunch time activities included Ultimate Frisbee, a Paper Dart Competition, American football and Giant Pictionary!

One of the things that I have enjoyed at Central this term has been working with some of the up and coming leaders of the school in years 6 & 7. It has been fantastic to see young people achieve the

goals that they set themselves and starting to get an idea what it means to be a leader. The young people involved loved it so much that they didn't just want it to be a talking about it, and as a group they decided to start on a project of repainting one of the walls that they all felt was a bit bland. We started to get into

this project as the term drew to a close so hopefully we will see a freshly painted wall in the New Year!



<u>SOUTH NEW BRIGHTON SCHOOL</u>

The amount that I got up to at South this term feels like it would be plenty enough to fill two terms to the brim.

Some of the highlights from South were the Legends camp (Y 5/6), building a trebuchet (that works), Athletics day, Sailing, putting together morning tea with two Y8's, Top Team, Boys Club and the Year 8's Formal.

This term at south felt as though I expanded relationships to more students as well as parents and staff. One reason for that is being involved in so many



of South's trips and events, these provide great opportunity to spend time with people outside of the norm, a great place for building on what is already in place!

It was great to be able to see real change in some of the young people that I have been involved with at South. One of the younger guys I work with started the year off with a few behavioural concerns, enough so that I was asked to come in alongside him. By the time that we got to this term you could hardly imagine him being any trouble at all. He would always look forward to seeing me every Friday morning, while we wouldn't do anything terribly structured the extra support around him was enough to help provoke change! Another of the younger boys I worked with was leaving to Australia at the end of the week, on the last morning before he finished at south he made it quite clear to me that he really valued the time that he had with me in the library on Friday mornings. "Matt, I've really enjoyed spending time with you every Friday in the library and looking at books of scary animals with you", again it shows me that it doesn't necessarily take a lot to make a big difference in the life of a young person.



GUYS DAY DUT

Another top Guys Day Out was run this term with 14 year 7 & 8 Guys from the three schools



attending. We also had 5 top leaders, all great male role models from different walks of life. The day included Surfing, American Football, Archery, a manly BBQ, a life talk and a bit more American Football! The most popular being the Surfing. Overall the young people rated the day a 9.2/10.

It was amazing to see how naturally surfing came to so many of them, only about 2 had surfed before and by the end of our surf session all but about 2 had managed to stand up on their boards. A huge part of that was thanks to the amazing surf coaches at Professional Surf Coaching /0800 80 Surf at Sumner.

The other top part of the day was finding out on the feedback forms that nearly 75% of the young people tried something new that day!








DTHER INVOLVEMENTS

There are also already many camps booked into my calendar which are always a highlight for me!
